



The World's Briefest DooDoo Voodoo Instructions

If you're one of those people who likes to cut to the chase...or if you're one of those lucky people who received a bottle of DooDoo Voodoo Concentrate from a friend, but didn't receive the instructions along with it, here's the short version of how to blend and use DooDoo Voodoo Concentrate.

Mix as little as 1/2oz of Concentrate, or as much as 2oz of Concentrate, with warm water in a sprayer bottle. Add the water first, then add the Concentrate (this helps avoid sudsing). Gently stir the bottle's contents (don't shake, which produces suds) before using.

For hard surfaces, go weaker; for carpet and upholstery, go stronger. BUT...it's better to treat multiple times with a weaker mixture than once with a stronger mixture.

Allow PLENTY of dry time in between treatments! The number one and two mistakes people make are not letting the area fully dry and not "getting outside the lines" of the hidden soiling (for instance, in carpet pad). The majority of the odor kill occurs at the final stage of drying, so it's important to let the area fully dry before determining if re-treatment is necessary.

If you're desiring to use DooDoo Voodoo with your carpet cleaning machine, we recommend that you don't put DooDoo Voodoo in your machine. A better way is to apply DooDoo Voodoo with a pump sprayer (available at a home improvement store for \$8 - \$15). Let it "dwell" for at least 15 minutes, then extract with your carpet cleaner. The longer the dwell time, the more will dry, so there may not be too much to extract. More thoroughly wetting the area will facilitate fuller extraction and will likely do a better job of getting at the contamination in your carpet pad.

Using a DooDoo Voodoo Blacklight, made by GE, will help you find *all* the areas that have been hit. Customers say our blacklight is more effective than other brands at locating soiled areas. We believe this is because the DooDoo Voodoo Blacklight may emit a different (better) frequency of ultraviolet light than other brands.
